

Meeting features innovative wetland and stream topics

"Even in dry times like we are experiencing across much of Kansas, people are looking forward to better times - wet times, and thinking about how they can manage their lands more efficiently - profitably and environmentally. This is true for many folks managing land with intermittent streams, rivers, playas, and other naturally-occurring wetlands," said Tim Christian, state coordinator for the Kansas Alliance for Wetlands and Streams (KAWS). "Cities are now looking at how wetlands and streams can help them improve water quality and meet storm water standards, too."

"To help individuals, municipalities, agencies, and organizations do a better job of managing these natural resources," he said. "Kansas Alliance for Wetlands and Streams is sponsoring a one-day workshop featuring a number of resource experts. The workshop will be held on Feb. 18 at the Gray County 4-H facilities in Cimarron with registration beginning at 8:30 a.m."

"This is a practical, how-to-get-it-done, agenda," Mr. Christian said.

The program will feature the staff of the Playa Lakes Joint Venture discussing creating success with new partnerships. Topic areas include opportunities to create, improve, or protect wildlife habitat, and where funding might be available to complete the work. City and county officials and staffs will appreciate hearing Dennis Haag, Tetra Tech EMI, Lenexa, discuss innovative and cost-effective ways to manage storm water, treat water to improve quality, reduce flooding, and even treat waste water using natural systems within urban

watersheds - large or small.

Those interested in student and adult stream education will find Alison Reber, StreamLink, Lawrence, an excellent source of information to excite kids, young and old, about the possibilities to learn more about streams and to help others become more involved in understanding and caring for streams. Mr. Reber will share a number of excellent ideas for promoting stream education in your community.

Western Kansas streams pose interesting challenges for those land managers experiencing stream bank erosion and other degradation with their intermittent flows and sand bottoms. Phil Balch, State Conservation Commission, Topeka, will discuss a variety of methods to stabilize these tricky areas and restore stream health. His agency administers a program to help landowners with cost-share and he will highlight how to get started in developing a plan for the Riparian and Wetlands Protection Program.

Mr. Christian said the meeting is an outgrowth of the efforts of three Kansas Alliance for Wetlands and Streams chapters covering about a third of the western counties. He noted that the Buffalo Wallow Chapter covers Finney, Gray, Greeley, Hamilton, Kearny, Scott and Wichita counties; Mid-Plains Chapter covers Edwards, Ford, Hodgeman, Kiowa, Pawnee, Pratt, and Stafford counties; and Prairie Wetlands Chapter covers Cheyenne, Decatur, Logan, Rawlins, Sheridan, Sherman, Thomas, and

Wallace counties. Kansas Alliance for Wetlands and Streams promotes improved wetland and stream education through chapters as well as getting quality projects completed through several funding sources.
