Samuel and his wife, Suetta or Luetta, and children Ellen, Alva and Nellie lived here for a few years in Nuttycombe and Eureka Townships. Their names did not appear in the newspapers, probably because they lived in the northwest part of the county. We have not

found them in the Haigler newspapers either. A small announcement appeared when they upset their wagon while hunting berries shortly after arriving here, in
