Trucks collide on Tuesday north of St. Francis on K-27

Two semi trucks collided late Tuesday afternoon 7 miles north of St. Francis on K-27. No serious injuries resulted from the accident.

Dale Patton, in an 18-wheeler hauling a grain trailer owned by Ronnie Zimbelman, had just unloaded wheat in town and was driving north on the two-lane oiled highway. It appeared he had slowed down and was turning west onto Zimbelman land.

At the same time another 18

wheeler trailing Patton's truck with an unidentified driver and "Lady's Transportation" logo, attempted to pass on the left side. The grain truck was already in the Zimbelman drive when the rig slammed into Patton's cab. His truck flipped on its side and major damage was received by both vehicles.

Waiting in a pickup for the Zimbelman truck, was Bob Zimbelman, who witnessed the event. He attempted to help Patton from the wreckage and other people

soon arrived to help. Amazingly the female driver was able to get out of the truck on her own power and did not seem injured. Witnesses said that after Patton was freed from the truck, he only appeared to have a cut to his head and small abrasions.

Diesel fumes filled the air as emergency personnel loaded both drivers into ambulances for transport to the Cheyenne County Hospital. The St. Francis Fire Department quickly doused the overturned rig to keep it from catching fire.

With harvest comes the dangerous combination of many oversized vehicles on the country roads all racing to beat the clock. Speed was not a factor in this accident but any crash could be devastating.
