Time is running out to sign-up for 2004 county Fair Parade

Have you entered something in the parade?
Time is running short and the Fair Parade Committee reports that entries are slow coming in.
"We have had a number of people talking to us about what they are entering but they have not signed up yet," said Carla Lampe, one of the Parade Committee.
This year's theme is "As Good As It Gets," which leaves many ideas and options for floats and individual entries. Besides floats, entries can include bikes, trikes, motorcycles,

horses, vehicles, clowns — anything which will make the fair parade more interesting. Prizes are also awarded.
The grand marshal will have a place of honor.
This year's parade will come down St. Francis' Washington Street from the east with all entries lining up at the high school. Chances are, not many of the entries will travel up the back streets as in year's past so be sure and join the crowd on Main Street.
The judging of the floats and the

antique cars will begin at 9:15 a.m. with the floats on College Street and the antique cars lined up in the drive north of the high school.
This year, the committee decided that it would be best if people had their entry description and forms to the committee by 5 p.m. on Friday, Aug. 6, so the script can be ready for the announcer early Saturday morning. They will take entries the morning of the parade.
The St. Francis Area Chamber of Commerce has volunteered to take charge of the parade. Members of the committee are Mrs. Lampe, Dawn Lucas, Kim Ritter, Gloria Bracelin, Rick Lucas, Brittany Lucas and Brooke Lucas.

Hunting safety course to be offered in August

According to the law, people who are 27 years old or younger and want to hunt must carry a certification card along with their hunting license. Certification cards can be obtained only after the individual has completed a hunter education course and all hunters who were born on or after July 1, 1957, must complete the course.
There is only one course offered each year in St. Francis. That course, held through the Kansas Wildlife and Parks, and again sponsored by Gardner Graphics will be held from 7 to 9 p.m. on Aug. 10, 12 and 13 and at 9 a.m. on Aug. 14. The Saturday class will last much of the day. There is no charge for the class.

This year the class is being limited to 30 and those interested will need to pre-register by calling Chet Gardner at (785) 332-2373.
The recommended age for the class is 12 years to adult but those younger will not be turned away. Others who have previously taken the class might want to renew their hunting knowledge and skills by taking the class. Instructors for the class are Chet Gardner, Tim Stimbert, Dick Rohweder and Bob Burr.
