



Angie Berens, executive director for the Cheyenne County Farm Ser-represented producers in Local vice Agency, said the county committee system has been around since the 1930s and represents grassroots democracy at its best. Committee members are local farmers who are nominated and elected by their peers.

"The men and women who make up the committee decide how federal farm programs are implemented locally," Director Berens said. "They use their judgment and knowledge to make decisions that shape national programs to fit local needs.' To begin the election process,

Director Berens says local producers must nominate candidates to run for a seat on the county committee. "You can't have an election without candidates," she said.

Cheyenne County is divided into three local administrative areas, each of which is represented by a seat on the committee. Committee members serve three-year terms, and the terms are staggered so each year local producers vote to fill at turned to the Farm Service Agency least one vacancy.
