# Cougars bounce back; win first game on the road

After losing their homecoming game to Pawnee Heights on Friday the Cougars bounced back for their first victory of the season against Triplains on a rare Monday night game.  
"It was good to get the win," head coach Max Keltz said, "The kids played hard."  
The score of the homecoming game was 56 to 6. The defense was kept busy throughout the game trying to contain a red hot Brandon Gray. When he was not passing the ball from the left side he was running at will.  
But the home loss was soon forgotten after the Cougars cruised to a 44 to 22 win at Winona.  
Scoring double digits in every quarter but the third, the offense to-

taled 417 yards. Defensively Jacob Jensen had a standout game with a team high 16 tackles and an interception that he took in for a score. Brandon Gordon also had a good game with 15 tackles.  
The Cougars next game will also be on a Monday when they travel to Culbertson, Neb. on Sept. 27.

Sept. 18: Transported a transient from Rawlins County line to Goodland.

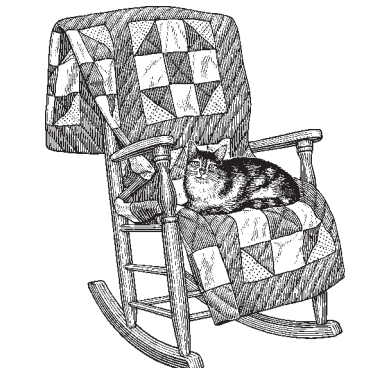
