prompt more to take advantage of this opportunity. The payment reduction is 10 percent of the annual rental payment for the acres actually haved or grazed.'

Emergency haying in Kansas started July 16. At least 50 percent of each field or contiguous fields must be left unhayed for wildlife; and at least 25 percent of each field or contiguous crop reserve program fields left ungrazed for wildlife, or graze not more than 75 percent of the stocking rate.

Emergency having and grazing in Kansas is allowed through Sept.

Sept. 12 and hay must be removed from the field within 30 days from the end of the haying period. Emergency haying and grazing is not allowed on the same acreage.
