I feel I can say this from experi-

Several years ago, I became ill and my personal physician was at a loss to determine what was wrong. As I got weaker and weaker, he continued to perform tests. In a way it was reassuring to know all of the diseases I didn't have. But each breath seemed to be a labor and I couldn't do anything but wait for

It was the morning of the Columbine shooting. As I was watching the news I got a call from my doctor who told me to go straight to Swedish and

They rushed me to a room at the great hands.

same time some of the victims from the high school were arriving to the emergency room.

I remember it being a pretty exciting and crazy place to be. A lot was going on but I just felt tired and

The nurses stuck tubes in me, drew more blood and additional tests were run. Finally they performed a video-assisted thoracoscopic procedure. In layman's terms, a tube was shoved up my nose so they could take a look at my lungs and scrape a sample.

From that they realized that I had contracted an airborne virus called boop (bronchiolitis obliterans organizing pneumonia). It was sort of a one-in-a-million deal. I was put on steroids and oxygen and, with time, I gained back my breathing and strength.

Months later I was shown an Xray of my lungs from when I was admitted to Swedish. The image was similar to a heavy, London fog. I'll never forget the tears in the nurses eyes and my doctor telling me thanks for hanging in and believ-

My hopes are that Jason and Dave both have a positive outcome as well. I know they are in
