ORDINANCE NO. 537 AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, ROADSIDE PARK; PROVIDING FOR A ROADSIDE PARK BOARD TO PROVIDE OVERSIGHT AND ASSISTANCE TO ROADSIDE PARK OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE; AND ESTABLISH ARTICLE 1A OF CHAPTER 12 OF THE 2003 ST. FRANCIS CITY CODE. Article 1A of Chapter 12 of the 2003 City Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, is hereby established to read as follows: ARTICLE 1A ROADSIDE PARK 12-1A01. OVERALL MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL. The mayor and city council shall exercise overall management and control over the St. Francis Roadside Park and grounds and will make final decisions concerning operations, maintenance, improvements and personnel. 12-1A02. ROADSIDE PARK BOARD. A roadside park board is hereby established to assist the city council in the operations and maintenance of the roadside park with its directives from the council being as follows: (a) To provide direct oversight and assistance to city council and city superintendent as to normal operations and maintenance of the roadside park. (b) To coordinate maintenance of the grounds and facilities, authorize

and schedule normal repairs and provide the council with capital spending recommendations. (c) To serve as a direct contact with members of the public in areas of public relations, comments and concerns. (d) Establish user fees and adopt such public rules and regulations as the board deems appropriate to assist in the day to day use and operation of the roadside park. 12-1A03. ROADSIDE PARK MEMBERSHIP. The roadside park board shall consist of five members appointed by the mayor with the consent and approval of the council who shall serve on an annual basis from May to May. The board shall consist of one council person, a city employee, with the rest of the members being at-large from the community. 12-1A04. ROADSIDE PARK MEETINGS. The roadside park board shall meet at such time and places as its members deem appropriate. Meetings shall be open to the public. 12-1A05. REPORTS TO COUNCIL. **Natural resources chief announced**

Agriculture Secretary Mike Johanns has announced the selection of Arlen Lancaster as Chief of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS).

"Arlen Lancaster's dedication, leadership and experience has well prepared him to serve in this new leadership role on our (Department of Agriculture) team," said Mr. Johanns. "He has a passion for conservation and I look forward to working with Arlen in this new capacity. I'm very confident that our nation's farmers and ranchers will have a strong advocate in him for improving the quality of our natural resources and conserving our land."

Mr. Lancaster succeeds Bruce Knight at Natural Resources Conservation Service, who was recently confirmed by the U.S. Senate as under-secretary of agriculture for marketing and regulatory programs. Mr. Lancaster has served as deputy assistant secretary of Congressional Relations at United States Department of Agriculture since April 2005. Prior to his service there, Mr. Lancaster served in various

senior staff positions in Congress, having worked since 1999 for Senator Mike Crapo, as a senior policy advisor and as the staff director for the Senate Subcommittee on Forestry, Conservation, and Rural Revitalization since 2001, he played a key role in crafting the conservation title of the 2002 Farm Bill. He also worked for Senator Robert Bennett from 1998 to 1999.

As Chief of Natural Resources Conservation Service, Mr. Lancaster will lead the primary federal agency that works directly with private landowners to help them conserve, maintain and improve their natural resources. The Natural Resources Conservation Service emphasizes voluntary, science-based conservation; technical assistance; partnerships; incentive-based programs and cooperative problem solving at the community level.

Mr. Lancaster is a graduate of the University of Utah with a bachelor of science and an avid fly fisherman and outdoor recreationist. He and his wife Staci live in Alexandria, Va.
