#### **Lavern Francis Goltl**

March 30, 1926 - Sept. 12, 2006 Lavern Francis Goltl died Tuesday, Sept. 12, 2006, at the Good Samaritan Village in St. Francis, Kan., at the age of 80. He was born March 30, 1926, in Ludell, the son of Mathias and Sophie (Toth) Goltl. He was the seventh of nine children born to Math and Sophie.

Lavern was baptized and confirmed at Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church in Ludell by the Reverend Paul J. Strege. He was baptized on April 4, 1926, and was confirmed on April 14, 1940.

When Lavern was 3-years old, he moved with his parents and family to the Goltl farm south of McDonald, where his father built the house and farmstead. He attended 10 of his 12 years of school in McDonald. During his seventh and eighth grade years, he attended school in Ludell as he needed restricted activity due to rheumatic fever. The Ludell home was close to the school where he lived with his mother, brother, Elmer and sisters, Evelyn, Elaine and Jane.

He graduated from McDonald High School in 1944, and spent the next two years on the family farm. He attended Kansas State University for two years then returned to the farm to work with his father and eventually succeeded him on the farm.

On June 10, 1961, Lavern was united in marriage to Bethel Louise Ochsner at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Goodland. They made their home on the family farm 4 miles south of McDonald in Rotate Township. Three sons and a daughter were born to their union.

He was a member of St. John Lutheran Church in Bird City. In earlier years he served on the church council and taught Sunday school.

could pronounce and spell most words. His great enjoyments were attending farm sales and auctions, watching football on television and keeping up with the scores.

As his health declined and he became homebound, he enjoyed watching the birds and activity outside the window, and talking about the weather and crops. He always felt that his health was held in his Lord's hands.

He is survived by his wife, Bethel; four children, Matthew and wife, Marty Frick Goltl of Wichita; David Goltl of Brooklyn, N.Y.; Alan Goltl of Brooklyn and Amy and husband, Mike Waters of Haviland; five grandchildren, Jack and Sophia Goltl of Wichita, Ellen, Owen and Brynn Waters of Haviland; five sisters, Irene Kehlbeck of Good Samaritan Village in St. Francis, Esther Spomer of Wamego, Evelyn Botti of El Sobrante, Calif., Elaine Johnson and husband, Oscar of Bird City and Lorna Jane Casa of San Miguel, Mexico; nieces and nephews, other relatives and friends.

"Farmers in Sherman, Cheyenne and Wallace counties, who suffered crop or livestock losses due to natural disasters may apply for Farm Service Agency emergency loans," Farm Service Agency Farm Loan Manager Patricia Eckhardt, said recently.

Counties also became eligible under existing legislation which provides that farmers in counties bordering on those which have been designated for disaster assistance, may also qualify for such assistance. Applications for assistance will be accepted by Farm Service

for specific information and application deadlines.

"Loans covering physical and/or production losses may be made at a 3.75 percent interest rate, and are scheduled for repayment as rapidly as feasible, consistent with the applicant's reasonable ability to pay," Ms. Eckhardt said.

Farm Service Agency loans covering physical losses may be used to replace installations, equipment, livestock, or buildings (including homes), lost through this disaster.

Agency. Please contact the office ering production losses may be used cropping enterprise, may have a to buy feed, seed, fertilizer, livestock, or to make payments on real estate and chattel debts. "Funds can also be used for other essential operating and living expenses," Ms. Eckhardt said.

To be eligible for an emergency disaster loan, an applicant must be operating a family size farm or ranch, must be unable to get credit elsewhere, and must have suffered a qualifying physical and/or production loss from the disaster.

Farmers who suffered at least a day through Friday. Farm Service Agency loans cov- 30 percent reduction to at least one

qualifying loss. Loan availability is limited to \$500.000, less the outstanding principal balance of any and all prior emergency loans.

Ms. Eckhardt asked that those farmers needing farm credit as a result of a natural disaster, and who think they are eligible for Farm Service Agency assistance, should make their applications at the Farm Service Agency County Office, 210 W. 10th, Goodland between the hours of 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Mon-
