McDonald-Bird City **Red Hatters**

There were three carloads of McDonald/Bird City Red Hatters that motored to Wallace on Sept. 19 to enjoy a day at the Clark-Robidoux house. This stately gothic revival style mansion reflecting New England architecture which is reflected in the "window wall" that is formed by the truncated hipped roof, and was built in 1880 by Harding Allan Clark and purchased by Peter Robidoux in 1909 as he was the general store owner in Wallace. At that time plumbing, electricity,

the kitchen, bath and tea room were added. Limestone bricks are between the walls and there are interior and exterior shutters to keep arrows from penetrating. The original floors are of white pine and walls are 171/2 feet tall. The historic house was vacated in

1982 and purchased in 2000 by Glenda and Bud Allaman. This structure merits the distinction of being on the Kansas Historical Register and is for community use. It has 10 rooms including a bridal suite and one bedroom is named Calamity Jane as she stayed there. The home sets on four acres. Phyllis Wingfield played a number on the organ by the bay windows in the music room. A delicious lunch was enjoyed and the business meeting followed.

The afternoon stop was at the Fort Wallace Memorial Museum and some walked past the wooden crosses in the cemetery. Everyone thanked Betty Lewis for making all the arrangements for a beautiful fall day in Wallace.
