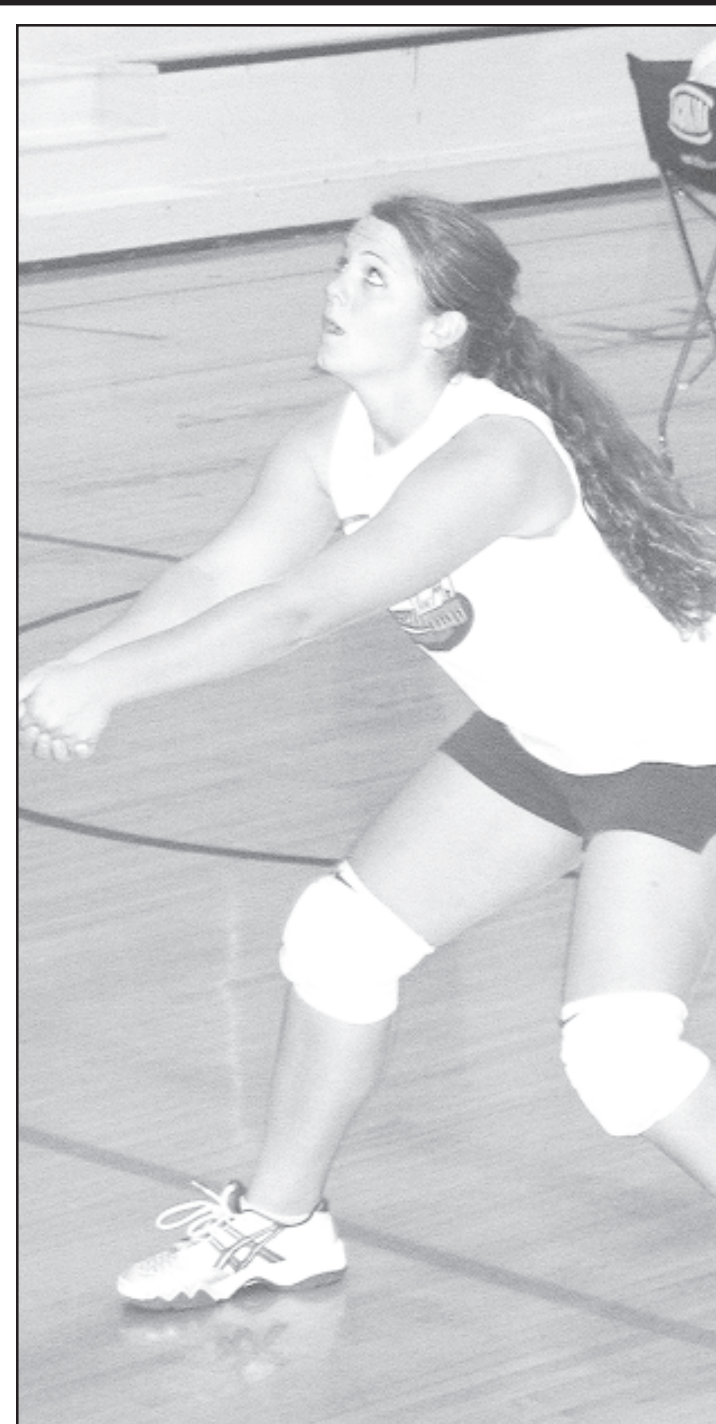

Rushing: Heath Antholz, 30 carries for 200 yards and four touchdowns, four two-point conversions.

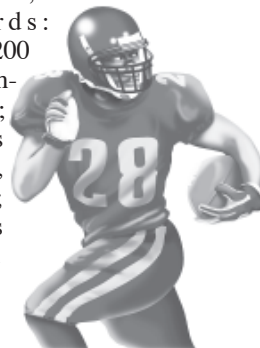
Passing: Caleb Keltz, three of seven for 84 yards and one touchdown pass.
