Student attends university camp

Jessie Smith recently returned from the Fort Hays State University Math and Science camp held on the university's campus June 8 through June 13. Only 24 girls from the state of Kansas were selected to attend camp based upon a student essay and teacher recommendation. The essay was based upon what you most like about math and science, and what you are most curious about regarding those subjects in addition to what you would like to do in the future regarding

math and science.

"Camp Scene Investigation" camp required the girls to solve a crime that had occurred. Several techniques were used to assist the girls in determining the actual suspect. Global Positioning System (GPS) technology was used to locate the crime scene and stolen goods. Soil samples were analyzed to determine the location of a crime. Ink samples were analyzed to eliminate suspects. Mathematical formulas were used to figure out who was at the crime scene and blood splatters at the crime scene were studied.

Sessions were also conducted by the Hays Police Department to determine the speed of a car from evidence remaining after a crash. DNA

fingerprinting was also studied. Jessie discovered she belongs to a group of 5 percent of the population who has an arched index finger. Careers in math and science were also conducted with sessions led by professors. The girls worked hard during the day experiencing and applying math and science. They had a chance to unwind at night with activities such as a spa night, swimming, astronomy and geocaching.

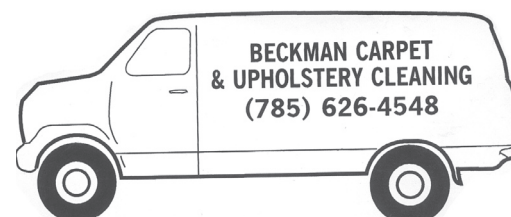
