"We ran into a good outside-shooting team and did not contain them as well as we would have liked to," said Coach Stefan. "We continue to improve and look forward to making some noise in the tail end of the season."

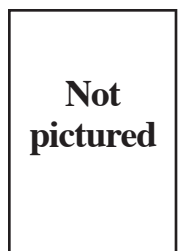
Mitchel Jensen and Kenan Reeh each scored two field-goal points, and Lance Leonard scored one free-throw point.

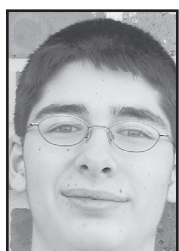
