Here is an interesting bit of Americana. Have you ever heard of Sam Born? I'll give you a hint: he was a candy maker.

Born emigrated from Russia to the United States in 1910. He had learned how to make candy in the Old Country, but knew he could do it better in America.

First settling in California, Born invented a machine that could insert a stick into a lollipop. The year was 1916.

That might not sound like much, but the people of San Francisco were so impressed they gave him the keys to the city.

Another one of Born's creations were Jimmies. These are the chocolate sprinkles that go on ice cream.

After moving across the country he opened a small candy store in New York City in 1926. Proud of the freshness of his products, Born used his name and called his

company "Just Born."

As the business grew he moved his operation to Bethlehem, Penn. To expand his line of candy, Just Born bought out the Rodda Candy Company in 1953.

The main purpose was to add jelly beans to their mix. But in the back of the building a group of women were making small, three-dimensional marshmallow treats by hand. Born and his family were fascinated by the chicks which Rodda made only at Easter time.

Originally it took 27 hours to make a single, yellow chick. But in 1954, Just Born began mass production of these little treasures that are now distributed throughout America and Canada. Thus became "Peeps."

Today Peeps are made for other holidays and they come in various shapes and colors. So the next time your kids or grandkids (or yourself) enjoy a Peep, you'll have Sam Born to thank for sharing them.
