

The site defines distracted driving as "any non-driving activity a person engages in that has the potential to distract him or her from the primary task of activity because it takes the driving and increase the risk of can endanger drivers' safety, "Studies show that, on average, texting is most alarming because

1) Visual – taking your eyes off the road.

2) Manual – taking your hands off the wheel.

3) Cognitive – taking your mind off what you're doing.

According to the National Safety Highway Traffic Administration, nearly 6,000 people died in 2008 in crashes involving a distracted driver, accounting for 16 percent of all traffic fatalities, and more than half a million were injured. It's a growing problem, with the proportion of drivers distracted at the time of fatal crashes increasing from 8 percent in 2004 to 11 percent in 2008.




