#### **Kanred Family, Community** and Education

The Kanred Family, Community and Education Club met on Tuesday, Sept. 14, at Cards and Gifts by Wanda. There were three present: Dorthy Mast, Leeanna Windell and Wanda Dowdy.

Wanda gave the lesson on Beef: Choices, Preparation and Flavor. Knowing where the cuts of beef are located and the cuts' characteristics will dictate preparation and cooking style. Quality grades indicate a cut of meat's palatability.

Components of palatability are flavor, tenderness and juiciness. When meat is processed, the processor can elect to have a United States Department of Agriculture inspector give the meat a quality grade. This grade is determined primarily by marbling and the tender. They can also marinate for

maturity of the animal.

Marbling is the amount Fruit juices: lime, lemon, apple, WITH A STORY TO TELL, this quilt is currently being shown at the Bird City Library. Dorothy of intramuscular fat, or fat pineapple, orange or tomato. interlaced with muscle. The more marbling a cut of meat has, the more flavorful and tender it will be. A cut may also have intramuscular fat, which is the fat between muscles and is generally cut away before or after cooking.
