

Cougars remain undefeated; 6-0!

Win number six for the Cheylin Cougar football team was a 54-0 shutout of the Weskan Coyotes on Friday night. This was a Western Kansas Liberty League and also a district win for Cheylin.

The Cougars scored once in the first quarter, twice in the second quarter, three times in the third quarter and twice in the fourth quarter.

"The team has continued to improve to move to 6-0," Coach Max Keltz said. "I thought they did a good job of staying focused despite the weather delay."

Next on the schedule for Cheylin is an out-of-town game with Natoma. Also left on their regular schedule are Greeley County at Cheylin and Brewster at Brewster.

"We are looking forward to competing against a new team in Natoma and hope we can continue to improve," Coach Keltz said.

An overview of the Cougar scoring against Weskan follows.

In the first quarter, the six points came on a 5-yard run by Caleb Keltz with an unsuccessful conversion attempt.

Dalton Magnani scored first in the second quarter with a 24-yard run followed later in the quarter when Chris Walden earning a score as the result of a 16-yard pass play from Keltz. Conversion scores came on an Ethan Young pass from Keltz after the Magnani touchdown and a Jared Cahoj rushing attempt following the Walden score.

The score was Cheylin 22- Weskan 0 at half time.

The third quarter was very productive for the Cougars. The team collected 18 points on three

touchdowns with no conversion points added to the score.

Score number one was on a 40-yard run by Magnani, Walden scored next on a 2-yard pass from Keltz and Cahoj ended the third quarter scoring with a 2-yard run. By the end of the third quarter the Cougars had collected a total of 40 points.

Before the evening was over Adam Orten scored on a 2-yard run and Heath Churchwell crossed into the end zone following an 18-yard pass from Kenan Reeh. Eddie Frisbie added two points from a rushing attempt following the Churchwell score.

This gave the Cougars a 54-0 shut out.

Offensively Cheylin rushed for 357 yards and passed for 62 yards for a total offense of 419 yards. Magnani led the way with 231 yards rushing. He was followed by Cahoj with 73 yards, Jeremiah White with 35 yards, Keltz with 10 yards, Reeh with 6 yards, and Orten and Noah Jones with one yard each.

Keltz was 4-of-6 on his passing attempts for 40 yards with Reeh being 2-of-2 for 22 yards/ Walden had three receptions for 40 yards while Churchwell had one for 18 yards and Justin Culwell, one for 4 yards.

Jones was credited with a sack.

On special teams, Magnani had six kickoffs for a total of 276 yards while Walker Janicke had two for a total of 80 yards and Adrian Garcia had one for 46 yards The team had two punt returns with Orten having one for 25 yards and White one for 8 yards.

The team has a 6-0 record for the season with a 4-0 record in Western Kansas Liberty League play.
