

# Legion Auxiliary celebrates 90 years

Approximately 85 members and officials of the American Legion Auxiliary and guests met Saturday to celebrate the American Legion Auxiliary's 90th. A meal and program was enjoyed by those attending.

A great time visiting was enjoyed as well as the beautifully decorated hall and tables - which was done by Carol Marsh, Carol Peters and Val Coleman.

Among those present were special guests, the Kansas American Legion Auxiliary president, Trish Ward, and her husband, Steve, who is the commander for the Detachment of Kansas, Sons of the American Legion. They traveled to Bird City from Louisburg to be at the celebration.

President Ward gave an enthusiastic greeting, telling that members need to let other people know what Auxiliary is, and to get the word out that new members are needed to join us as we serve our soldiers who are fighting and those who have fought for freedom and then educate and work

with the young people and our community.

The American Legion Auxiliary began in 1919, with dedicated women across the country devoted to America's veterans, young people and communities. The women in the American Legion Auxiliary make a difference in the lives of many Americans. They educate children, organize community events, and help our nation's veterans through legislative actions and volunteerism.

The Auxiliary is the world's largest women's patriotic service organizations with nearly 1 million members in 10,100 communities. Auxiliary members are a unique group of women, joined in the fellowship of volunteerism, patriotism and dedication to veterans, the young people and the communities.

Co-chairman Hulda Dorsch spoke a few minutes about the ladies we have in the Bird City Auxiliary and then turned it over to Joy Anderegg who announced the different ladies who would

receive special awards for their many years of service. As she called the names, each lady stood up and Wanda Dowdy took them their award.

Co-chairman Rose Gordon then told about some of the things that the group does, including our hospital gift program, where gifts are sent to the different hospitals, so that these veterans can shop for Christmas presents for their family and loved ones.

They also head the Cheyenne County Support Our Troops (SOS) project providing Christmas for the troops in war zones. Last year a van load of gifts were sent and over \$2,000 to help with shipping and other needed items.

The Auxiliary also contributes to Santa Day, gives \$150 toward the Lynette DaProne Scholarship, helps with the blood mobile and obtains the Bingo license and conducts games twice a month from October through March, which helps the Auxiliary to have money for some of our programs. In the spring, the members tell the "Pop-

py Story" to the third graders at school and sell poppies on Memorial Day weekend.

Mrs. Gordon also shared about the American Legion Riders, who are a motorcycle group, that rides to raise support for our soldiers and veterans - especially the wounded vets.

A delightful Musical Extravaganza hosted by Neala Carmichael was enjoyed. The group is from St. Francis with a lot of talent. There was singing, music, dancing and instrumental solos - trumpet and piano.

For the closing of the musical part of the program, the audience was asked to join in the singing of "God Bless America."

As Mrs. Dorsch took over the microphone again, she recognized all the American Legion members, all the people who had served in the military, fighting for our freedoms and all the American Legion Auxiliary members that were present. It was a memorable evening for everyone.
