Topic of conversation was switched from what to do about the broken pipes to: What to do about the infestation of drain flies from the broken pipes. Smith reported a problem in mid July when they were doing some remodeling in Apartment 10. When they removed the drain thousands of these little black flies swarmed out.

These flies are tiny little black flies that look like fruit flies but come from the drain system and when there is an abundance of them they swarm out of the drains. They do not bite like flies, nor are they harmful only annoying and hard to get rid of. The concern is, they are
