

## Conservation service program available

"Many landowners and produc- "yes," then they need to comers ask 'Is Conservation Service program (CSP) Right for Me?" says Keith D. Kisner, Superviso-Service (NRCS) staff, at the U.S Department of Agriculture Service Center in Atwood. The current Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) signup deadline is Jan. 7.

Mr. Kisner says landowners and producers can play a large role in determining whether or not the program is right for them and explains how.

"First, can they answer "yes" to the following three questions?"

• Are you willing to commit time to inventory and document vour conservation activities and production system to determine eligibility and ranking?

farming activities and are you willing to continue maintaining records to document your conservation activities? (Records will be used during Natural Resources Conservation Service field visits to verify the accuracy of application information before contracts are approved.)

• Are you ready to enter into a 5-year contract requiring you to apply additional conservation activities and to improve, maintain, and manage existing conservation activities?
