He explained some of the new requirements and gave the council an invitation from Ryan Murray, Cheyenne County Emergency Manager, to attend an information meeting with Jason Moses from the Kansas Adjutant General's office.

He reported that the deputies had performed 112 hours of patrol and casework in the city during the month of December.

The city council contracts law

enforcement through the county commissioners. The council approved the 2012 contract for \$34,000. This is the same amount as last year's.

Undersheriff Beeson submitted a cooperation agreement with Cheyenne County for the storage and use of the Egger's Building. The amount remains the same at \$300 per month through 2012. The 2012 Mutual Cooperation Agreement was approved.

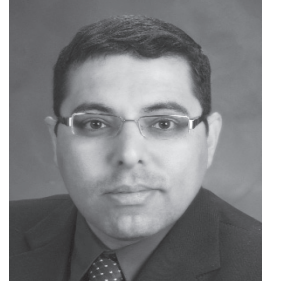

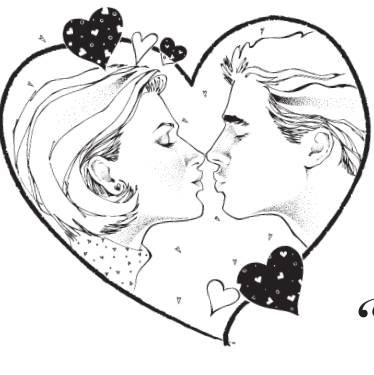
