The basketball season is now over and it's time to reflect a bit on the season. Both teams had great seasons and deserve lots of credit. Let's take this as a final opportunity to congratulate our basketball teams....

As always the ladies will come first. Senior Shayla Hubbard led the team in scoring with 13.0 points per game. Junior Allie Frisbie was the only other player to average double figures in points, coming in at 10.7 points per game. Hubbard was the leader in steals with 3.9 per game. She also knows how to pass the ball and averaged a team-high 4.5 assists per game. Sophomore Elizabeth Keltz led the team on the boards with 11.3 rebounds per game. Keltz also averaged 1.1 blocked shots per game. I would also like to extend my personal congratulations to Shayla Hubbard and Allie Frisbie for being named to the all-league team. Both players are very deserving of this great honor. However, I will say that Elizabeth Keltz being left off the all-league team is a major snub. Keltz averaged 9.7 points per game, 11.3 rebounds, 2.0 steals, and 1.1 blocked shots. I believe that this deems her worthy for at least honorable mention. The fact that the coaches of the league didn't see it that way is a true travesty.

On another note, the ladies finished the year with 13 wins and seven losses. This was their first winning season in quite some time, and the ladies should have nothing but optimism heading into next year. All players on the team will return, with the exception of Shayla Hubbard, who will be a Kansas Wesleyan Coyote next year. Both Allie Frisbie and Elizabeth Keltz will return to be the stars of the team. Diana Garcia is

another returning starter who has the skills to make a major contribution. Kalin Ritchey is the final returning starter, and she will be a great help.

Final thoughts: It was great to see the ladies have a winning season. Shayla Hubbard was, in my opinion, the most valuable player of the year on both sides of the ball. Danea Magnani was the team's best player off of the bench. Look out for our ladies to be a force in the league next year.

Next comes the men. Ty Carmichael led the team in points per game with 12.9, the leader in rebounds per game with 11.1, and the leader in steals per game with 3.4. He also led in assists with 2.1. Walker Janicke led the team in blocked shots with 1.0 per game. Congratulations to Ty Carmichael on being named to the all-league team. Congratulations to Casey Vandike on being named all-league honorable mention. A strong case could be made for Walker Janicke, who averaged 9.1 points per game and 8.5 rebounds per game.

Our boys finished the season with 10 wins and 12 losses. Although this was the first finish under .500 in a couple of years, the men still played a good season. Next season could be interesting for the Cougars, as they lose all five of their starters to graduation. The Cougars can count on Devon Janicke and Carter Porubsky to be the two center pieces for next year's team. The rest of the starting positions will be up for grabs.

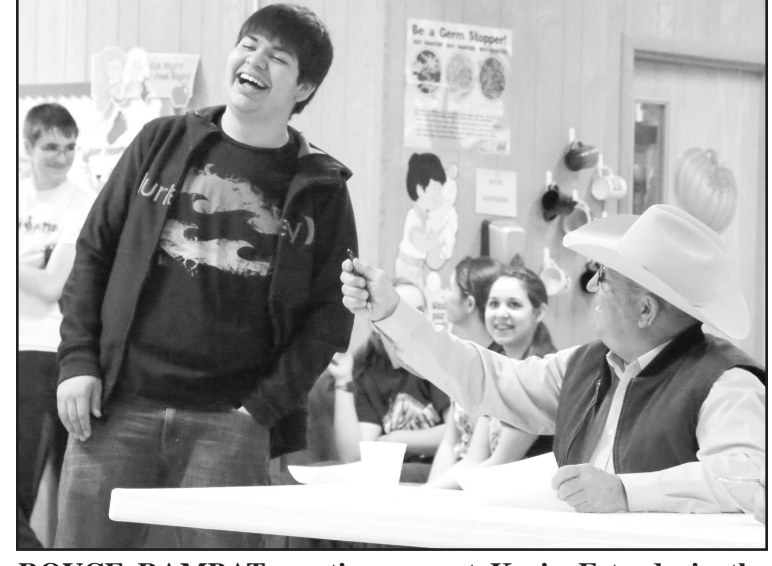

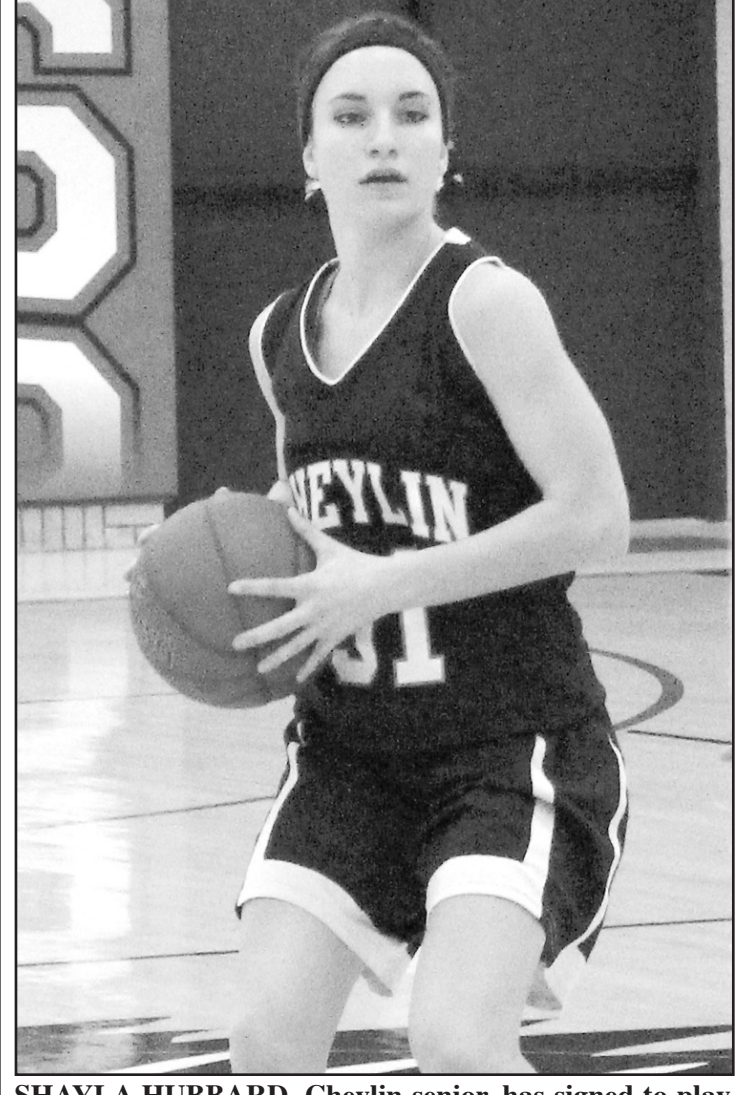
Congratulations to our FFA team on placing third at poultry judging and fourth at entomology. Allie Frisbie should be given accolades for her seventh place individual finish.

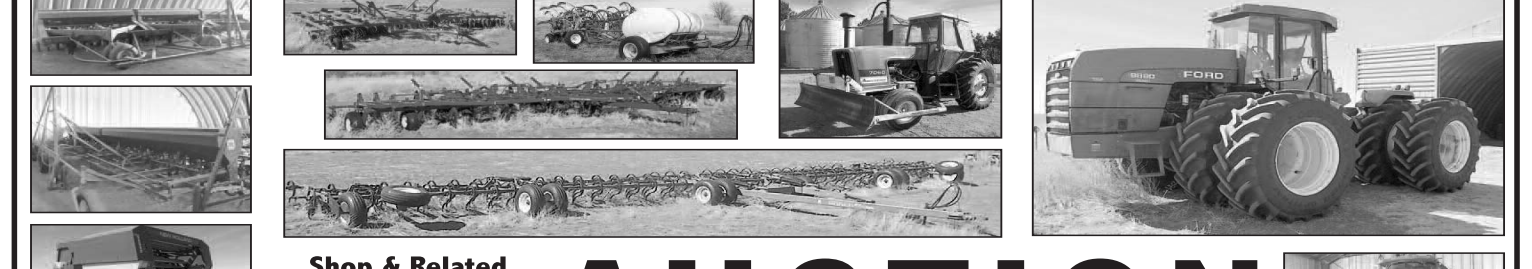
