Registration for youth soccer starts tomorrow

It's soccer sign-up time. The Norton County Region of the American Youth Soccer Organization will be registering players for the spring season.

Early registration will be 2-8 p.m. Friday, Jan. 10 and 2-6 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 11. Regular registration will be 2-6 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 31 at the Norton Recreation Center.

The eight-week soccer season will be from April 3 to May 17 with games on Saturday mornings. Practice times and locations are determined by the coach of each team.

Any players wishing to register after the final registration date will be placed on a waiting list until there are enough players to form additional teams.

The cost is \$30 for early registration and \$35 for regular registration.

Cost includes a complete uniform (shirt, shorts and socks) that the players keep, insurance and all games and practices.

Shin guards are not provided but are required by worn for all practices and games.

Teams are mixed and divided into age divisions of ages 4-5, 6-7, 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13.

During previous seasons, the older groups were combined. Older groups can be created if there is enough interest.

All players are guaranteed to participate in a minimum of half of all games that they attend.
