Annual wrestling tournament is set for Saturday in Norton

The annual J.R. Durham Wrestling Tournament is set for Saturday in the Norton Community High School Memorial Gym.

Teams from Atwood, Beloit, Hoxie, Leoti, Quinter, Russell, Scott City, Smith Center, Norton and Cozad, Neb. will begin competition at 10 a.m.

Round One will start things out at 10 a.m. on three mats. A 10 minute break will be held after the first round. The Championship Semi-finals will begin at 11:30 a.m. on two mats. At the same time, the Consolation Quarter-finals will begin on the third mat.

After a 20-minute break, the Consolation Semi-finals will begin at 2 p.m. on three mats.

A 30-minute break will be held after the Consolation Semi-finals. The Consolation Finals for third and fourth will begin at 3:30 p.m.

At around 5 p.m., Norton's former state wrestling medal winners from 1944, 1954, 1974 and 1984 will be honored. The 1944 team placed fourth in the state tournament, the 1974 team finished third in the state tournament and the 1984 team placed seventh in the Class 4A state tournament. The pep band will play the na-

tional anthem and the cheerleaders and dance team will perform. The Championship Finals will follow on one mat around 5:30

All times are estimated and may vary according to the progress of the tournament.

Plaques will be awarded to the top three teams and medals to the top four wrestlers in each weight class. An "Outstanding Wrestler" will be chosen by vote of the
