

Norton wins annual wrestling tourney

Despite five lineup changes due Black "Wrestlers of the Week". to injuries, Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School wrestling team won the championship of the J.R. Durham Wrestling Tournament held on Saturday in the NCHS Memorial Gym in

The No. 2 state ranked (Class 3-2-1A) Blue Jays rolled up 175 points to easily outdistance No. 1 state ranked (Class 3-2-1A) and defending state champion Hoxie, who ended with 150 points. Hoxie had won the Durham Tournament the last seven years. Norton edged Hoxie at the start of the season for the championship of the Hoxie Invitational and the Blue Jays are currently undefeated in tourna-




