Norton boys edge Trego 41-40

Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School boys basketball team rallied in the third quarter to overcome an eight point first half deficit, then outscored the visiting Trego quintet by one point in the fourth period to earn a hard fought 41-40 Mid-Continent League victory here Friday.

The win extends Norton's record to 6-1; Trego fell to 8-2.

The visiting Golden Eagles held an 8-5 lead after a low scoring first quarter and outscored Norton 13-8 in the second period to take a 21-13 halftime advantage. Norton's only points in the first quarter came on two-point and three-point shots by senior forward Dan Roeder. In the second quarter, junior center Ryan Maddy swished two baskets and two free throws and senior center Jered Sloan hit his first basket of the night on a jumper in the lane with six seconds

Maddy hit three baskets, Sloan scored on two baskets and junior point guard Kyle Kats hit his first points of the night as he buried a trey and swished a free throw in Norton's 14 point third quarter.
