

# Lady Jays defeat Victoria, place 5th in MCL tourney

Coach Kevin Jilka's No. 6 seeded Norton Community High School girls basketball team took a half to get rid of the jitters, then ran away from No. 4 seeded Victoria 39-24 on Saturday in Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays to place fifth in the Mid-Continent League Basketball Tournament.

It was the second straight victory for the Lady Jays, who evened their season record at 5-5. After losing their tourney opener 33-28 to No. 3 seed Trego, they defeated No. 7 seed Hill City 54-34 on Thursday.

The score was tied 7-all after the first quarter and Norton led by just 14-12 at intermission. Junior forward Amber Engelbert kept the Lady Jays in the game in the first half with a three-point shot in the first quarter and another in the second quarter.

The Lady Jays went inside to senior center Anna Berry and sophomore center Chelsea Cox for most of their points in the second half. Berry hit five baskets for 10 points in the second half and finished with a team-high 12 points. Cox swished four second half baskets and scored 10 in the game. Engelbert ended with 9 points. The Lady Jays outscored the

Lady Knights 14-8 in the third quarter to extend their advantage to 28-20 and put 11 more points on the scoreboard in the final stanza while limiting Victoria to just one basket and two free throws.

'Our girls have not played at Gross Memorial Coliseum, so they were a little nervous at the beginning," said Coach Jilka. "We were okay once we settled down.
