Commandments reveals our inability to fully live up to God's standards. Whether in our relationship with Him or our relationship with others, we fail often, and sometimes miserably. We, therefore, owe a great debt to God because of our sinfulness. But God, in His great mercy, has paid the price for our sins by sending His Son Jesus
