Olathe, Kansas, at 1:30 p.m. on May 5, 2004. The purpose of the Hearing will be to determine whether the proposed Settlement is fair, reasonable, and adequate, and entitled to final approval by the Court, and the amount of attorneys' fees and reimbursement of litigation expenses to be awarded to Class Counsel. expenses to be awarded to Class Counsel.

THE LITIGATION

Plaintiffs, on behalf of themselves and all others similarly situated, brought this lawsuit (the "Class Action") against Microsoft. Plaintiffs alleged that Microsoft unlawfully used anticompetitive means to maintain a monopoly in markets for certain software and, as a result, overcharged consumers who licensed its MS-DOS, Windows, Word, Excel and Office software. Plaintiffs allege that Microsoft's actions violated the Kansas Antitrust Act and the Kansas Consumer Protection Act. Microsoft denies Plaintiffs' allegations and maintains that it developed and sold high quality and innovative software products at fair and reasonable prices. Rather than have the Court determine whether Plaintiffs or Microsoft are correct at trial, the parties decided to settle the case. The Court will decide after the hearing on May 5, 2004, whether to approve the Settlement.

By Order dated October 24, 2003, the Court certified the following Settlement Class:

Microsoft Applications in this settlement means Word, Excel and Office versions designed for computers with the above MS-DOS or Windows operat-

THE PROPOSED SETTLEMENT

Under the proposed Settlement, Microsoft will provide up to \$32,000,000 in vouchers to Class Members. Upon presentation of proper proof of claim, each Class Member will receive a voucher worth (a) \$5.00 for each purchase of a Microsoft MS-DOS, Windows versions 1.0 to 3.11, Windows for Workgroups, Windows NT Workstation, Windows 2000 Professional, Word, Excel and Office software license, and (b) \$10.00 for each purchase of a Windows 95, 98, and Millennium Edition license.
