Hospital gives midyear update to commission

By VERONICA MONIER

The Norton County Commissioners heard a mid-year report on the Norton County Hospital at the Jan. 26 meeting.

Hospital Administrator Rich Miller said the renovation project is in the middle of Phase IV and is expected to be finished in mid-March. He said they are on schedule, with the exception of a 60-day delay.

Chief Financial Officer Brian Carlton said the hospital was guaranteed \$3.9 million for the renovations and had spent about \$3.5 million so far. Mr. Miller said the \$3.9 million should cover all of the expenses, even with recent change orders. He said the hospital made its first payment on the loan from Prairie Land Electric in
