

Huskies fall to Logan 71-49

The Northern Valley Huskies lost to Logan 71-49 on Jan. 30 and to Brewster 70-32 on Jan. 31.

LOGAN
“We were slow coming out of the gates and got behind and then it became a game of free throws,” said Northern Valley Coach Jason Dibble. “There were 74 attempts with Logan going 37-52 from the line for over half of their points in the game.”

“Avery had a really good night shooting the ball and Joey was rebounding until he fouled out with three minutes left in the third quarter.”

Avery Thalheim led scoring for the Huskies with 16 points. He was followed by Garth Gebhard, 11 points; Joey Copper, 9; Jesse Hilburn, 8; Henry Griffiths, 2; and Clarke Nelson, Cole Kinderknecht and Thomas Ostmeyer, 1 each.

Scoring for Logan were Kyle Burge, 16; Troy Babcock, 14; Bryant Reese, 12; Tyson Triplett, 10; Kyle McClurg and Seth Diggs, 8 each; Zack Sammons, 2; and Kevin Pinkerton, 1.

Husky rebounding honors went to Ostmeyer with 8, Copper with 7, Gebhard and Thalheim with 3 apiece, Kinderknecht with 2, and Hilburn and Griffiths with 1 each.

Northern Valley steals were made by Copper with 3, and Hilburn and Kinderknecht with 1 each.

Hilburn led assists with 4, followed by Kinderknecht and Ostmeyer with 2 each, and Gebhard and Copper with 1 apiece.

The Husky junior varsity lost 14-10.

“We knew how athletic this team could be,” said Coach Dibble. “They came out and jumped on us from the beginning and never let up the whole half. We had some scoring opportunities early but were not able to convert some easy baskets which led to fastbreak points for them.”
“Right now our biggest problem is consistently scoring night in and

night out. We sometimes make shots more difficult than they should be and need to continue to work on making the game easier than we are playing it right now. Thomas is really starting to rebound better as well as looking to score more.”

Ostmeyer led scoring with 9. He was followed by Gebhard with 8, Kinderknecht with 6, Nelson with 3, and Hilburn, Thalheim and Copper with 2 apiece.

Rebounding honors went to Copper with 9, Ostmeyer with 6, Gebhard with 5, Kinderknecht, Thalheim and Andrew Sheley with 3 apiece, and Hilburn and Nelson with 1 each.

Thalheim and Copper led assists with 2 each, followed by Sheley and Ostmeyer with 1 apiece.

The Northern Valley girls basketball team was defeated 56-42 by Logan on Jan. 30 and 62-46 by Brewster on Jan. 31.

“Logan did a great job on the offensive side of the ball,” said Coach Bill Lowry. “It is hard to beat a team that shoots 51 percent. We did a good job of shooting from the perimeter. I continue to see improvement in how we think and move.”

Regan Fessenden led scoring for the Huskies with 3 three-pointers and 5 free throws for 14 points. She was followed by Kelli Cole, 12 points; Lindsey Graham, 4; Lindsey Jessup and Alasia Eagleburger, 3 each; and Jessica Holmes, Serena Woodside and Jena Jessup, 2 apiece.

For Logan, Val Jackson led scoring with 6 two-pointers and 3 free throws for 15 points, followed by Michaela Berg, 12 points; Kati Chestnut and Melanie Berg, 9 each; Lanee Webb, 4; Jenny Noel, 3; and Megan Brumbaugh, 2.

Northern Valley out-rebounded Logan 20-18. Leading rebounds for the Huskies were Graham with 8 and Woodside with 4.

The Trojans topped the Huskies in steals 7-3. Making steals for Northern Valley were Fessenden, L. Jessup and Graham.

Woodside made 2 of the Huskies 4 assists. Logan had 2.

Northern Valley had 16 turnovers and Logan had 10.

“We started a little slow, but the girls continued to battle hard all

night,” said Coach Lowry. “We need to cut down on turnovers.”

Graham led scoring for the Huskies with 11 points. She was followed by L. Jessup, 8 points; Woodside and J. Jessup, 7 apiece; Fessenden, 6; Cole, 5; and Eagleburger, 2.

Rebounding honors went to Woodside with 5 and Graham with 4. The team totaled 16 rebounds.

Out of 8 steals, Graham took 3 and J. Jessup stole 2.

Leading assists were Eagleburger with 3 and Graham with 2.
