Lady Jays take big, early lead in Tuesday win over Oberlin

Coach Kevin Jilka's Norton Community High School girls basketball team made amends for allowing Oberlin to rally for a 55-52 overtime win on Jan. 6 in Oberlin when they jumped out to a big lead and held off the Lady Red Devils for a 54-40 victory on Tuesday in the high school gym.

In the Jan. 6 loss, Norton held quarter leads of 12-8, 25-19 and 34-29 but Oberlin's full court press forced Norton turnovers and sophomore guard Whitney Newell had to hit a basket at the buzzer to tie the score at 45-all and send the game into overtime, where the Lady Red Devils prevailed.

On Tuesday evening, the Norton girls made up their minds that this scenario would not repeat. With five different players scoring, led by sophomore center Chelsea Cox's three field goals and sophomore guard Karlie Jones' two-point basket and threepoint basket, the Lady Jays tallied 19 points in the first quarter and limited Oberlin to just 6 points on three baskets.

Although Norton's point production dropped to 11 points in the second quarter, the Lady Jay defense held Oberlin to just 5 points on two baskets and a free throw to take a 30-11 halftime lead. Jones scored 7 of Norton's points in the second period on another twopoint and three-point basket and two free throws.

Both teams scored 11 points in the third period and the Lady Jays still led by 19 points with one quarter left. The Lady Red Devils put up a lot of shots in the final stanza, many of their attempts coming from long range. They hit 4 of 29 three-point attempts in the game and all four successful shots came in the fourth quarter when they hit 18 points. The Blue Jays hit 13 points of their own, which was plenty to hold off the rally attempt by the visitors from the Northwest Kansas League. Cox hit all three of Norton's baskets in the fourth period as the Lady Jays swished 7 of 12 free throws in the period.

"We played great for two and one-half quarters but ended fighting for our lives," said Coach Jilka. "We didn't respond well to them making a run at us. We need to learn to put teams away. We must make better decisions when teams

Oberlin's points came mostly from the perimeter. Senior Abby Ream and junior Jamie Elwood each hit 10 points for the Lady Red Devils.

As a team, Norton shot very well. The Lady Jays hit 3 of 7 from beyond the arc for 43 percent, 16 of 28 two-point attempts for 57 percent and 19 of 35 overall for an excellent 54 percent accuracy.

Meanwhile, Oberlin swished just 4 of 29 from long range for 14 percent, 12 of 32 two-point shots for 38 percent and 16 of 61 overall for just 26 percent.

The Lady Jays scored on 13 of 28 free throws for 46 percent while the Lady Red Devils connected on just 4 of 10 for 40 percent.

Norton grabbed 4 offensive and 29 defensive rebounds for 33 total. Oberlin pulled down 17 offensive and 15 defensive caroms for 32 total.

Cox had a double-double as she pulled down 12 rebounds in addition to scoring 14 points. Berry grabbed 6 caroms, followed by Jones, Newell, 5 each; Amber Engelbert, 4; Becca Ebert, 1.

Norton had 17 offensive assists. Newell and Jones led with 5 each, followed by Engelbert, 4; Berry, 2; Cox, 1. Oberlin recorded 11 assists.

Norton had 4 steals and Oberlin had 9. Cox was the leader in thefts with 2; Jones and Berry had 1 each.

Norton boys hold off Oberlin

Coach Doug Reusink's Norton **Community High School boys** basketball team defeated Oberlin 61-35 on Jan. 6 in Oberlin but received a scare from the Red Devils before pulling out a 42-36 win on Tuesday night in the Norton Community High School Memorial Gym.

With Egan Grafel, Oberlin's 6'7" senior center, leading the way, the visitors took a 12-9 lead by the end of the first quarter. Grafel, who came into the game averaging 26.2 points and 13.6 rebounds per game, hit three baskets in the first period and two in the second period when Norton outscored Oberlin 11-10 to narrow the Red Devils' lead to 22-20 at halftime.

Norton received balanced scoring in the first half. Junior guard Aaron Overlease hit a trey in the first quarter and a trey and twopoint shot in the second stanza. Senior center Jered Sloan swished a basket in each quarter while senior forward Dan Roeder, senior forward Brian Luft, junior center Ryan Maddy and sophomore center Heath Vincent each hit baskets.

Defense was the name of the game in the second half as the Blue Jays put together two more 11 point quarters while limiting the Red Devils to just 2 points on two free throws in the third quarter and 12 points in the fourth quarter on three field goals, two of them treys, and two free throws. Grafel did not hit a field goal in the second half. His only points came on two free throws in the third period for Oberlin's only points.

Sloan and Maddy warmed up for Norton in the second half, each hitting four field goals.

Norton held a 37-28 lead with just 1:35 left in the game but junior Lance Fortin buried a threepoint basket and Oberlin got the ball back after junior guard Aaron Overlease hit a free throw for Norton.

Senior Matt Monderoripped the nets from long range with 1:12 showing and suddenly Norton's lead had been reduced to 38-34. Brian Luft and Kyle Kats each hit a free throw to make it a 40-34 game but Jason Thomas connected on two free tosses for the Red Devils with 24 seconds remaining to make it 40-36.

It was the Red Devils' last hurrah, however, as the Blue Jays took the ball down court and, just before the final buzzer, Overlease lofted
