Blue Jays outscore Plainville in close 54-43 win Friday

Friday night's 54-43 win at Plainville was too close for comfort, according to Norton Community High School boys basketball coach Doug Reusink.

"We'd beaten them pretty easily in the league tournament (66-36) but I knew they'd be tough at home," said Coach Reusink. "We're playing just well enough to win. We're not as sharp mentally as we need to be.

Senior forward Jared Foley stole the ball and drove down court for a layup to make it 22-15 but Plainville scored the next seven points as junior post man M.J. Klein hit two jumpers and senior post man Joel Hrabe scored, was fouled and hit a free throw to make it 22-all.

The Jays grabbed a 25-22 halftime lead as junior point guard Kyle Kats scored from outside and Sloan hit a free throw.

Hrabe hit two baskets inside and Klein swished a free throw to put Plainville back on top 27-25 at the 6:47 mark of the third period. Sophomore center Heath Vincent scored inside for Norton and senior forward Dan Roeder hit his second basket of the night but Dix hit his final basket of the game to

tie the score at 29-all with 5:05 left. Overlease buried another timely three-point basket to break the tie.

Overlease contributed 10 points on 2 of 5 from beyond the arc for 40 percent, 2 of 3 two-point shots for 67 percent and 4 of 8 overall for 50 percent shooting.

Neither team shot very well overall from the floor. Norton hit 3, Gosser 100-02, Joel Hrabe 50 just 3 of 9 trey tries for 33 percent, 15 of 37 two-point shots for 41 percent and 18 of 46 overall for 39 percent.

Plainville swished just 4 of 14 trey tries for 29 percent, 13 of 36 two-point attempts for 36 percent and 17 of 50 overall for 34 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton connected on an excellent 15 of 21 for 71 percent compared to 5 of 9 for 56 percent for Plainville.

Norton pulled down 9 offensive and 19 defensive rebounds for 28 total. Plainville grabbed 10 offensive and 16 defensive caroms for 26 total.

The Lady Jays held quarter leads of 17-4, 36-6 and 56-17.

Norton's pressing defense was very effective as the Lady Cardinals turned the ball over 29 times and, when they did get the ball across the timeline, they hit just 22 percent of their shots.

On the offensive end, Norton scored from every location on the floor, including six shots from beyond the arc. Sophomore guard Karlie Jones hit two three-point shots in the first quarter and two more from long range in the second quarter and finished with 20 points for the night. In addition to four shots from long range, she hit converted 21 of 33 tries for 64 per-8 of 11 free throws. She was 4 of 6 on treys for 67 percent accuracy and hit charities at a 73 percent Inside, sophomore center

Chelsea Cox scored 17 points. She hit a sizzling 6 of 8 from the field for 75 percent and was 5 of 8 from the line for 63 percent. Cox hit two baskets in the first quarter, a basket and free throw in the second period and three baskets and 4 of 7 free throws in the third period. Junior forward Amber Engelbert contributed to Norton's first half scoring when she hit a three-point shot in each of the first two quarters and a two-point basket to score 8 points in the game.
