Athletes compete in meet

Norton Community High School track and field athletes competed in the Smith Center Junior Varsity Meet on Monday.

Norton's highest finish was in the girls division where Lacey Roe won the javelin with a personal best throw of 99-feet, 8-inches.

Danielle LeClair placed second in the 800-meter run in 2-minutes, 56-seconds and fourth in the long jump with a leap of 11-6. Crista Rhoades placed sixth in the 800-meter run in 3:42.

Brianne Nelson finished fourth in the 200-meter dash in 32.4 and set a personal record in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles where she placed sixth with a 61.7 time.

Kylee Witt placed fourth in the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 59.8. She also ran the 200-meter dash in 33.8 seconds but did not place.

Rhoades also ran the 1,600 meters in 8:14.0 and placed sixth. Roe also competed in two events in which she did not place. Her distances were: shot, 21-9 and discus, 56.

In the boys division, Corey Rutherford placed third in the discus with a personal best 101-3 effort and third in the javelin with a distance of 114-9. Rutherford also recorded a distance of 26-5.5 in the shot put but did not place.

Also competing but not placing and results were: Jared Bebb, 13.9, 100-yard dash; 30.46, 200-meter dash; and 15-3, personal best, long jump; Dan Cummings, 31.3, 200-meter dash; 15.57, 100-meter dash; and 12-9, long jump; Josh VanSlike, 30-9, personal best, shot; 84-3, personal best, discus; and 78-9, personal best, javelin.

Norton wrestlers compete in Classic

Norton seniors James Annon, 130 pounds, and Jordon Haussermann, 160 pounds, competed in the 18th annual Senior Classic Wrestling Dual, in front of 1200 fans March 26, at Landon Arena in the Kansas Expo Centre in Topeka.

Annon took an early 1-0 lead with an escape, then gave up a takedown on his action late in the second period. Annon let Kriegbaum escape off bottom late in the match in hopes of taking him down but was unable to do so and lost 3-1.

Thirty-eight of the top senior wrestlers in the state were in the dual. Wrestlers were selected to either the Blue Team, coached by Manhattan's Lee Woodford and (Kansas City) Turner's Peter Sierant or the Red Team, coached by Scott City's Jon Lippelmann. The Red Team was a 32-30 winner.

Haussermann, who placed third in the state tournament and finished with a 37-12 record, wrestled Olathe South's Conor Fitzgerald, who was the state runnerup.

Annon was a two-time state champion for Norton Community High School but he faced Jake Kriegbaum, Abilene, one of only 16 four-time state champions in Kansas history.

The first period ended in a scoreless tie. Haussermann got an escape in the second period to take a 1-0 lead but Fitzgerald got an escape and takedown with 20 seconds left in the match to win 3-1.

Annon compiled an enviable 35-2 record this season. Kriegbaum saw a 100-match winning streak come to a close this season but avenged his 4-2 overtime loss to Colby's Cole Garcia later in the state finals with a 2-0 victory.

"Jordon also wrestled well," said Coach Johnson. "Late in the match, Jordon made a move and almost put Fitzgerald on his back," said Coach Johnson.

"Annon's match was a close one; it could have gone either way," said Norton's Coach Bill Johnson. "James wrestled all out. He was definitely the aggressor. He was a huge underdog but represented Norton very well."

"The western Kansas wrestlers did extremely well in this dual."

Proposed Solid Waste Landfill

NORTON COUNTY PROPOSED MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE LANDFILL

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has reviewed an application from Norton County to construct and operate a municipal solid waste landfill called a small arid landfill (SAL). The SAL would be located in the southwest quarter of Section 25, Township 2 South, Range 23 West, approximately one mile northeast from the City of Norton. The site has been permitted for waste management activities since 1976, and includes a closed municipal solid waste landfill, an inactive solid waste incinerator, an inactive incinerator ash landfill, an active construction and demolition waste landfill, and an active yard waste composting facility. The site also includes a recycling center, tree and brush burn area, waste tire storage, and appliance salvaging. The proposed SAL would cover approximately 18 acres on the County's existing 60-acre facility. The SAL is designed with approximately 393,000 cubic yards (approximately 45 years) of capacity for municipal solid waste disposal and daily/intermediate cover material. The bottom of the SAL is proposed at elevations ranging from approximately 2,275 feet to 2,305 feet, resulting in excavation depths up to 20 feet below the existing ground surface. The completed surface of the SAL (including the final cover) is proposed at elevations ranging from approximately 2,297 feet to 2,335 feet, representing fill depths up to 10 feet above the existing ground surface. The final cover on the SAL is proposed to consist of at least 56 inches of soil with native grasses established on the surface. Norton County has certified that the application described herein is consistent with the regional solid waste management plan and is compatible with the surrounding land use. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with the state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is today providing public notice of their intent to issue an amended permit to Norton County to allow the proposed SAL described herein. A copy of the administrative record which includes the permit application, engineering drawings, draft permit, and other information with respect to this permit action will be available for public review from Friday, April 16, 2004 through Monday, May 17, 2004, during normal business hours at the following locations:

Anyone wishing to comment on the proposed facility should submit written statements by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, May 17, 2004 to Paul Graves of KDHE at the address listed above, or via facsimile to (785) 296-1592, or via e-mail to: pgraves@kdhe.state.ks.us. Comments which are postmarked by May 17, 2004 and received within one week thereafter will also be considered. KDHE will subsequently issue written

responses to all formal comments received through the end of the official public comment period. After consideration of all formal comments as described above, KDHE will make a final decision on whether to issue the permit. Notice of the decision will be given to the applicant, anyone who submitted formal comments, and those who requested notice of the final permit decision.
