## A DAY AT THE CARP DERBY

## Twenty-fourth annual Busch Carp Derby held July 17-18

The weather was hot but fishing was good at the 24th annual Busch Carp Derby at the Keith Sebelius Reservoir last month. Fishermen divided up into 27 two-person teams to catch 253 pounds of carp or 332 fish.

The top ten teams who snagged the most fish received cash prizes.

Winners were determined by counting the number of fish caught per team. The largest fish per team was weighed each day.

Taking first place this year were Rex and Phil Buford, Colby. They brought in a total of 49 fish, weighing a total of 21 pounds, 8 ounces. Buford and Buford received \$150 for their efforts.

The Bufords took ninth place last year with 23 fish.

Coming in second place for the third year in a row were Curtis Glenn and J.D. Sanderson, Norton. Glenn and Sanderson brought in 40 carp — 19 pounds, 5 ounces — and won \$100.
