Twenty-seven seconds later, Ostmeyer was in the end zone again on another pass from Copper, this one 36 yards. Hilburn ran in the extra points, making the first quarter score 30-0.

In the second quarter with 8:44 on the clock, Copper dashed 6 yards for a touchdown with Hilburn running in the extra

Avery Thalheim made it into the end zone with 5:11 showing for another Husky touchdown. Nelson ran in the extra points, giving Northern Valley a 46-0 lead.

Golden Plains made their first touchdown of the game at 4:57 in the second quarter when Jesse Miller ran the ball 46 yards. Drew Stevenson ran in the points after touchdown.

At 1:45, the Bulldogs made their second and last touchdown on a 1 yard scramble from Miller. The extra points attempt fell short, making the tally 46-14.
