## Darold Gene Arnold

Darold Gene Arnold, 78, died Sept. 14 in Norton.

He was born Oct. 14, 1925, near Brewster to Murice and Genevieve (Ramsey) Arnold.

He was a veteran of World War II, being one of the original soldiers of the 75th Infantry Division of the U.S. Army. He was part of "C" Company in the 289th Regiment, fighting in the Battle of the Bulge, Ardennes campaign, pushed the Germans out of Belgium, and later in the Colmar pocket and Rhineland campaign.

He married Anita Shook on June 10, 1950, in Stockton. They made their home in the oil field on the Saline River, Ellis County until 1963, when they moved to a farm they called "The Ponderosa" near Lenora. His wife died Jan. 22, 1999.

He was a Mason and a past member of the Lenora Rural Fire Board.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife, an infant son,

Murice Roy, two brothers, Robert "Bob" Arnold and Marland Ray "Pete" Arnold, and one infant sister, Edna Rosa.

Survivors include two daughters, Linda and Gail Palmberg, Hays; Judy Arnold, rural Lenora; one brother, Larry and Sandee Arnold, Wauwatosa, Wis.; two sisters, Liz and Carl Chaney, Natoma; Lois Jones, Pampa, Texas; and three grandchildren.

Viewing will be from 3-8:30 p.m., Friday at Enfield Funeral Home and at the United Parish Church in Lenora Saturday morning.

Funeral services will be held at 10:30 a.m., Saturday at the United Parish Church with burial that afternoon at 1:30 p.m. at Plainville Cemetery.
