ORDINANCE No. 1537
 AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING VEHICULAR PARKING ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF MADISON STREET IN NORTON, KANSAS, STARTING AT THE EASTERN TERMINUS OF STATE STREET AND MADISON STREET, THENCE WEST 90 FEET.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1: That from and after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful to park any motor vehicle on the south side of Madison Street from its eastern terminus with State Street and Madison Street, thence west 90 feet.
Section 2: Violation of this ordinance shall be punishable in accordance with the provisions of the Standard Traffic Ordinance of the City of Norton, Kansas.
Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its publication in the official city newspaper, and the signs being duly placed.
