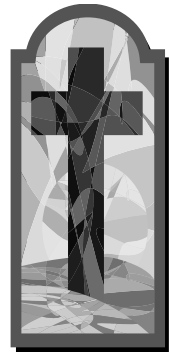
## Poet Came to Wilsonville
