Wheat should get good start

The rains that passed through the area were definitely a blessing. Most fields got at least 1.5 inches of rain or more. Now, the wheat will get off to a good start with sufficient moisture.

The only problem is that the moisture will likely delay wheat planting past the optimum date of Sept. 30 for most of the area, with the exception of Trego County, which is around mid-October.

Farmers may want to bump up their seeding rates by 10 to 20 pounds per acre if they are delayed by more than two to three weeks. The increase in seeding will compensate for a lower tiller number from the later planting date and an earlier than normal date when the wheat becomes dormant. Farmers should definitely increase the seeding rate if they are a month or more behind schedule.

When planting wheat late, it is always better to plant too much than not enough because it is difficult to predict what the weather is going to do. By planting heavier, there is less need to rely on wheat tiller development, which is primarily formed in the fall, although most growth occurs in the spring.

For fields already planted, there is a potential that furrow rows could have washed in and inhibited germination because the wheat is buried under more than two to three inches of soil. Therefore, some farmers may have to replant their wheat. The decision whether to replant should be made field by field.

cialist, says if a grower planted 60 pounds of seed per acre using 7inch rows under normal growing conditions, that would be 12-13 seeds per foot of row and the grower could expect about nine seedlings out of those 12-13 seeds

"In a thin-stand situation, if you end up with four or five seedlings," he said, "I'd say leave it. But if a farmer thought that was not thick enough, there is still time to go in and cross-drill at a rate of 40 to 60 pounds. Just don't plant too

"If it falls below three or four seedlings or so per foot of row, then I would replant, but use a seeding rate of 60 to 80 pounds. If you have a partial stand, you don't need to replant at the full rate."
