Dennis Clark Kasson, 52, Wilsonville, died Tuesday at the Via Christi-St. Francis Burn Center in Wichita. Mr. Kasson had been hospitalized as a result of injuries he suffered in a plane crash, July 16.

He was born Sept. 22, 1952, in Norton to Curtis and Evelyn "Bobbie" (Meyers) Kasson. He graduated from Wilsonville High School in 1970, and attended Central Nebraska Technical College at Hastings.

On Oct. 1, 1971, he and Mary Margaret "Sandi" Harr were married in Wilsonville. They lived and farmed on the family place.

He was a former member of the Lower Republican Resource District. He was a member of the Aircraft Owner and Pilots Association and a member of Floyd's Wednesdays Social Club. He was a licensed pilot and enjoyed anything

with cars and planes.

He was preceded in death by an infant brother, James Wynn Kasson.

Survivors include his parents, Curtis and Bobbie Kasson, Norcat; wife, Sandi of Wilsonville; a son, Matthew and Jennifer Kasson, Norcat; a daughter, Melissa and Bradley Uehlin, Danbury, Neb.; a brother, Michael and Moni Kasson, Morrow, Ga.; mother-in-law, Mary Ann John, Arapahoe; and four grandchildren.

Funeral services were held today at the Wilsonville school building. Kirk Kasson officiated at the service. Burial was in the Wilsonville Cemetery.

He worked hard, loved learning, and lived modestly. Glen attributed his long, happy life to eating right, not smoking, daily exercise, and wearing his seatbelt.

Former resident hits 100 years

Lloyd J. Harvey, Greeley, Colo., and a former 56-year resident of Norton, celebrated his 100th birthday with a celebration on Sept. 5 at the Norton Senior Citizen Center.

Mr. Harvey was born Sept. 2, 1904, in Republican City, Neb., one of 12 children. His upbringing on a farm is what he said helped him live a long life.

He recalled that when he was small, there was always a barrel of apples in the family's cellar. When the children would go to do chores or just play in the yard, they usually had an apple in their pocket for a snack.

He said having that, and not candy bars for a snack, is the reason he has all his original teeth.

The Harvey family did not have a car when he was a child and he

was 12-years old before he even saw a car. He told of the day his father drove the family's first auto into the garage and ran through the back wall because he couldn't stop.

"I remember hearing him say, 'Whoa', before he hit the wall," Mr. Harvey recalled

Mr. Harvey held many jobs during his working years including being a lumberjack and a semi-trailer driver. During his years in Norton, he was foreman of Johnson Fruit Co. Later he worked at the Coca Cola Bottling Co. After retirement, he painted for several years.

A highlight in his life came during the 1935 Republican Valley flood when he helped to save 32 people, who were stranded by the floodwaters.
