Norton to host annual wrestling tournament

The annual J.R. Durham Wrestling Tournament will be held on Saturday in the Norton Community High School Memorial Gym. Teams from Norton, Atwood,

It is the 40th annual wrestling tournament held in Norton and the eighth annual Durham tournament. It was renamed seven years ago in honor of J.R. "Jake" Durham of Norton, the former longtime wrestling coach at

Jake's many honors include membership in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame and Kansas High School Wrestling Hall of Fame. Jake and his wife, Ruth, still reside in Norton.

At around 4:45 p.m., Norton's former state wrestling medal winners from 1945, 1965, 1975, 1985 and 1995 will be honored. The 1965 team won the state championship. The 1945 and 1975 teams placed fifth in the state tourney.

The pep band will play the national anthem and the cheerleaders and dance team will perform.

The championship finals will follow on one mat around 5 p.m. All times are estimated and may vary according to the progress of

the tournament. Plaques will be awarded to the top three teams and medals to the


