

OBITUARY

Msgr. Armand F. Girard

April 26, 1921 ~ January 5, 2005

Manhattan, died Wednesday morning, January 5, 2005, at the St. Joseph Village in Manhattan.

He was born on April 26, 1921, in Aurora, Kansas, one of eight children born to Leon and Blanche (Desilet) Girard. He grew up in a home filled with love for God, family and others. It was here that his vocation to the priesthood was fos-

His studies for the priesthood took him to St. Benedict's College in Atchison, the St. Louis Preparatory Seminary, and Kenrick Seminary also in St. Louis. He was ordained June 10, 1945, in Sacred Heart Cathedral, Salina. Immediately after ordination he was sent to the Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C. where in two years, he obtained a Licentiate in Canon Law.

His first assignment was at Sacred Heart Cathedral in 1947. Four years later he was made pro-Chancellor of the Diocese and held that position until 1954 when he was assigned pastor of SS. Peter and Paul parish in Clay Center where he supervised the building of a new parish hall and fostered enlargement of the church, developing its sanctuary and adja-

In 1959, he was appointed as the first pastor of St. Mary Queen of the Universe in Salina, where he was instrumental in enlarging the St. Mary's grade school and in the construction of a rectory and convent. His parish also helped build the inter-parochial high school.

It was at this time, he was appointed Vicar General, a position he held from 1959-1983 under Bishops F.W. Freking, C.J. Vogel and Daniel Kucera.

Msgr. Girard visited Rome and attended some sessions of the Second Vatican Council. On September 21, 1967, he was installed as first pastor of the newly established Immaculate Heart of Mary Church in Hays. He also served as a member of the Fort Hays Catholic Campus Center Development Committee and helped arrange for the purchase of Catholic Campus Center prop-

Msgr. Girard was assigned to St. Francis of Assisi Parish in Norton on June 18, 1975. In each parish he

Msgr. Armand F. Girard, 83, of served, he became involved in both Marriage Tribunal. In addition to his church and community affairs. A lasting tribute to his ministry in the Norton community is the existence of several college scholarships for young people of the parish. He was chaplain for the Catholic residents at Norton State Hospital and established the R.E.A.C.H. program for the residents. He also served on the Norton State Hospital Citizen Advisory Committee during his tenyear stay. He was a Board member of the Valley Hope project and is an Emeritus member to this day. He was also interested in providing railroad facilities to the community. It was in Norton that he celebrated his 40th jubilee.

> Msgr. Girard's next assignment was in Goodland in 1985, when he was pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. Here he continued the same caliber of parochial solicitude and development that characterized all his assignments in the Salina Diocese. He was a member of the Goodland Chamber of Commerce and was known and appreciated for his efforts with the Ministerial Al-

On July 1, 1995, Msgr. Girard announced his retirement as he was approaching his fifty-year mark of ordination as a priest of the Salina Diocese. Following his retirement he took up residence at St. Isidore's Catholic Student Center adjacent to Kansas State University in Manhattan. For the past eight years, he has been a contract priest for Fort Riley.

Early in his life, Msgr. Girard joined the Knights of Columbus, and from 1976 to 1978 was State Chaplain of the Catholic Men's Organization. He has served at various times on college and hospital boards of directors. Within the Diocese of Salina, he has held positions on the 2686.

duties as Vicar General were assignments to the Diocesan Board of Consultors, membership on the Priest's Senate and the Diocesan Pastoral Council, and the Consultive Board of Marymount College in

Msgr. Girard is survived by one sister, Dorothy Blackwell of Aurora, Kansas and by numerous nieces and nephews, great nieces and nephews and great-great nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by twin brothers: Alpha and Alphonse Girard, by another brother: Jean Paul Girard and by three sisters: Aurelia and Madeline Girard who died in infancy and Marie Letourneau.

A Vigil Service was held at 7 p.m. Sunday, January 9, at the St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Manhattan, with Rosary and Honor Guard by the Knights of Columbus.

Mass of Christian Burial was held 11 a.m. Monday, January 10, at the St. Mary Queen of the Universe Catholic Church in Salina with Bishop Paul Coakley as celebrant and Bishop George Fitzsimmons and brother priests as concelebrants. Interment will follow in the Mt. Calvary Cemetery in Salina.

RESOLVE TO BE HOLY

Be Holy: We have just entered into the year 2005. God clearly gives instructions to His children about what they are to focus on this coming year. The Holy Spirit inspired the apostle Peter to write to God's elect-those who are chosen by God through the sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit for obedience to Jesus Christ (1 Peter 1:1-2). The goal God has set before Christians is high, yet attainable. ... Prepare your minds for action; be self-controlled; set your hope fully on the grace to be given when Jesus is revealed. As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. But just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: 'Be holy, because I am holy.' " (1 Peter 1:13-15)

The writer of the Book of Hebrews, while warning against falling away from the faith, rebuked his readers for still being spiritual infants. Many Christians continually need someone to remind them of the elementary truths of God's Word. Messages on forgiveness and salvation are most certainly Biblical, however they alone won't mature a believer in Christ. Christians must find teaching that will take them from milk on up to the meat of God's Word. Solid food is for those who want to mature and diligently train themselves to distinguish what is truly worthwhile spiritually from what is only a lethargic form of godliness.

The purpose of the church is not to make people feel good about themselves but to give God's children an opportunity to become increasingly holy. In our day of social Christianity, the newest fads and latest programs have produced carnal Christians. If the apostle Paul were alive, his letters to many churches today would mirror his epistle rebuking the first century worldly Corinthian church.

"Holy," "saint," "sanctification"-all three of these words have been translated from one Greek word that is difficult to translate into English. Its gist, however, is easy to grasp—it means to be separated, set apart or different from. Morally, it means to be striving heartily after God's purity and righteousness instead of seeking after the ways of the world and the things in it. A Christian who is set apart for the Lord lives his life in a way that pleases God. He uses his talents and the things that God has given him to glorify Jesus Christ, not himself or the church he attends.

People are often guilty of perceiving "church" to be just another club in town competing for numbers or a building where lots of programs are held. Rather, they should come to know that "church" is people who have received Christ into their hearts and who are being changed into His image through the illumination of the Holy Spirit and the written Word of God. Jesus is the Head, the church is His Body.

The Bible instructs Christians to always conduct themselves in a manner worthy of the gospel (Php. 1:27). Paul wrote, "Count yourself dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus...Sin is not to be your master." (Rom. 6:11,14)

As a Christian, you are purchased by the very blood of Christ and your New Year Resolution for 2005 is a mandate from God, "Be holy." The Bible teaches that if you love the Lord, then you will obey His commands (1 John 5:3). And you have God's promise, He will faithfully empower you to live out what He calls you to-an abundant life of holiness.
