

# Wrestlers win duals over Smith Center, Trego

Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team had a good warmup for the Newton Wrestling Tournament of Champions last night by winning duals with Smith Center and Trego in Mid-Continent League action in Wilmeth Kirk Memorial Gym in Norton.

Norton is competing today and Saturday in the Newton tournament. Norton will be the team from the smallest enrollment category. Twenty-four teams will compete, most of them in Class 5A and 6A.

Last night, Norton defeated Smith Center 45-26 and outscored Trego 73-4. In the other dual of the evening, Smith Center downed Trego 46-26.

In the victory over the Redmen, the Blue Jays won five of the 10 matches wrestled and won the other four matches by forfeit.

# Five area football players chosen for Shrine Bowl

Five area senior high school football players are among those chosen to play for the West squad in the 32nd Annual Kansas Shrine Bowl All-Star Football Game, according to David Mize, executive director.

The game will be played July 30 at the Kansas State University Stadium in Manhattan.

The 34 team members selected by media, including former Norton Telegram publisher Dick Boyd, and the bowl coaching staff include: Austin Kingsbury, Smith Center; Matt Smith, Oakley; Ty Brunswig, Trego; Brock Lohr, Goodland and Mike Hester, Hays.

Also selected, but not from the immediate area, was Matt Myers, Southeast of Saline, Norton's regional playoff opponent.

Other players chosen to the West squad are: Jesus Alvarado, Ulysses; Jonathan Antrim, Jason Gragg, both of Salina Central; Drew Bietau, Manhattan; Gary Chandler, Wichita Heights; Jordan Cruz, Shawn Smith, both of Hutchinson; Quinn Cunningham, Dustin Heckrot, both of Salina South; Kendall Fisher, Sean Teter,

Kingsbury rushed for 2,002 yards and scored 23 rushing touchdowns for the Class 2-1A state champions. He also caught four passes for 132 yards and three scores.

Smith led Oakley with 1,709 yards on 198 carries and 31 touchdowns and had 71 tackles.

Brunswig was a linebacker and offensive lineman for Trego. He

recorded 58 solo tackles and 134 total tackles.

Lohr finished with 1,517 yards for Goodland from his running back position and scored 24 touchdowns.

Hester was a linebacker-center for Hays High. He recorded 57 solo and 128 total tackles, forced three fumbles and blocked four field goals.

Myers capped a great defensive career with 129 tackles last fall. He finished his career with over 400 tackles. He also rushed for 767 yards for the Regional champions.

The West training camp will be held again in Salina at St. John's Military School while the East all-stars will return to Emporia State University for their training camp.

The all-star gridders for both the West and East squads were selected from 444 players nominated by their high school coaches.

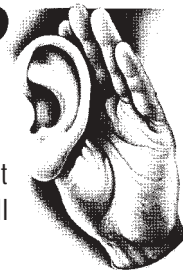
