# Blue Jay wrestlers are Regional champions!

Leading from start to finish, Coach Bill Johnson's No.1 state ranked Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team powered to the championship of the Class 3-2-1A Regional Wrestling Tournament held Friday and Saturday at Trego Community High School in WaKeeney.

The Blue Jays amassed 208 points to outdistance second place and No.5 state ranked Oakley, who totaled 180 points.

Placing third with 163.5 points was No.3 state ranked St. Francis. No.4 state ranked Hoxie placed fourth with 115.5 points. Oberlin followed in fifth with 113 and No.8 stated ranked Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays was sixth with 92.

Trego placed seventh with 71.50, Plainville was eighth with 67, No.9 state ranked Cimarron was ninth with 45.5 and Hill City finished in tenth with 45 points.

Ellis and Atwood tied for 11th with 37, followed by Leoti, 27.5; Lakin, 26; Sublette, 20; Deerfield, 16; Quinter, 9; Montezuma, 5; Kinsley, 0.

This regional tournament was unquestionably the toughest of the four in the state with six of the top 10 ranked teams in the state competing and 35 percent of the individually state ranked wrestlers competing.


### Nine qualified for state

Nine of the 14 Blue Jay wrestlers who competed placed in the top four of their weight class and qualified for the Class 3-2-1A State Wrestling Tournament this Friday and Saturday at Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays.

Oakley also qualified nine and eight St. Francis and eight Oberlin wrestlers also earned a trip to the state tournament.

Norton had six wrestlers in Saturday evening's finals and five won championships. Winning championships were sophomore Logan Keiswetter, 103; junior Clay Madden, 112; junior Luke Pfannenstiel, 140; junior Lance Roe, 152 and senior Michael Sprigg, 275.

Junior Jon Harding placed second at 130 pounds.

Logan Keiswetter was seeded No.1 at 103. In the first round, he pinned Aaron Helm, Oberlin, in 1:06. In the semi-finals, he pinned No.4 seed Tanner Popp, Hoxie, in 58 seconds. In the championship finals, he wrestled No.3 seed Bobby McDonald, TMP. Keiswetter led 8-3 after one period and pinned McDonald in 3:12.

Keiswetter is now 27-6. No.2 seed Steve Samuelson, Oakley, won third with a 9-4 decision over Chris Orr, Hill City.

Clay Madden was seeded No.2 and Richard, who is ranked No.3 in the state, received the No.1 seeding at 112. In the first round, Madden pinned Nathan Porter, Leoti, in 3:03. In the semi-finals, Madden pinned Scott Jewell. Trego, in 54 seconds. Madden and Richard squared off for the title and Madden pinned him in 1:32 to win the gold medal.

Third place went to Daniel Guebara, Deerfield, with a 5-2 decision over Terry Urban, Oberlin.

Davvid Stanley won his first 171 pound match by pinning Mark Axelson, Plainville, in 1:38. In the nextround, he wrestled No.2 seed and No.6 state ranked Jeff Dennis, Oakley, and was pinned in 37 seconds. In the consolation bracket, he pinned Aaron Maddox, Cimarron, in 59 seconds. In his next match, he won an 8-6 decision over No.3 seed Caleb Simon, Quinter. In the semi-finals, he lost a 13-2 major decision to No.5 seed Gannon Reichert, Oberlin, to end his season with a 25-17 record.

Reichert placed third with a 9-8 decision over Justin LaBarge, Ellis. Derek Ross, St. Francis, pinned Dennis in 1:09 to win the championship.

At 189 pounds, Shane Stanley was pinned in 1:49 of his first match by Marcus Nutting, Hill City. In the consolation bracket, he pinned Chris Hazen, Ellis, in 47 seconds. In his next match, he lost a 14-11 decision to Tyrel Plankenhorn, Sublette, to end his season with a 6-7 record.

Kyle Rietcheck, Oakley, upset No.2 state ranked Tyler Wiesner, Thomas More, 5-1 to win the championship. Wiesner was third in the state tournament last season. Tyler Brungardt, Plainville, placed third with a 7-2 decision over Michael Malay, Trego.

Blake Hillebrand was seeded No.5 at 215 pounds. In the first round, he was pinned in 5:51 by No.4 seed Jake Padgett, Oberlin. In the consolation bracket, he pinned Alan Crawford, Plainville, in 56 seconds. In his next match, he lost a 7-4 decision to Jacob Kessler, Lakin, and his season ended with a 16-17 record.

No.2 seed Tim Erwin, Hoxie, placed third with an 8-1 decision over Padgett. Aaron Racette, Oakley, No.1 seed and No.4 state ranked, won the championship with a 13-2 major decision over No.3 seed Brennon Wilger, St. Francis.

Two of three Blue Jay wrestlers competing for the consolation championship were winners. Winning bronze medals were sophomore Nathan Broeckelman, 119 and sophomore Blake VanEaton, 145. Finishing in fourth place was junior Jeremy Harding, 135.

Madden is a two-time defending state champion and is ranked No.1 in the state. Sprigg is defending state champion and also ranked No.1.

Keiswetter, Broeckelman and Roe are all ranked No.3 in the state in their weight division. Roe is a two-time state placer and Broeckelman placed second last year.

Jeremy Harding is ranked No.4 and Jon Harding is ranked No.6. Pfannenstiel is not ranked but placed in the state tournament his freshman season. He was injured last season.

Also competing for Norton but not qualifying for the state tournament were sophomore Kent Mann, 125, who placed last season at 103; senior Korey Look, 160; junior Davvid Stanley, 171; sophmore Shane Stanley, 189 and senior Blake Hillebrand, 215.

"Going in, I thought we needed to qualify a minimum of seven wrestlers for the state tournament so nine is a good number," said Coach Johnson. "If all nine score points and place we will be okay. Several of the area teams have about as many wrestlers going as we do and several from back east have many more qualifiers.

"We had a good tournament and wrestled well overall. We finished strong with a 7-2 record in our last nine matches.

"In this regional, there are always wrestlers who stay at home who would have qualified in any other regional. I feel badly for our wrestlers who didn't make it. Several would have scored at the state tournament."

Madden was named winner of the Regional Wrestler of the Year award, a new award from the KanMadden is now 29-3.

Gage Reichert, Oberlin, placed third with a 5-0 shutout of Mark Samuelson, Oakley.

At 140 pounds, Luke Pfannenstiel was seeded No.1. In his first match, he pinned Chris Barnhurst, Sublette, in 1:19. Next, he won a 13-3 major decision over Robert Binning, Atwood. In the semi-finals, he won a 15-0 technical fall over No.5 seed Jake Weigel, Plainville. In the championship finals, he wrestled No.3 seed Kelly Younkin, Oakley. Neither wrestler scored in the first period. Pfannenstiel led 2-1 after two periods and finished with a 4-2 decision to win the championship.

Pfannenstiel is now 27-3.

No.2 seed Jordan Gienger, St. Francis, placed third with an 8-4 decision over Weigel.

Lance Roe was seeded No.1 at 152 pounds. In his first match, he won a 19-2 technical fall over Luke Brin, Plainville. Next, he won a 14-5 major decision over John Smith, Hill City. In the semifinals, he won a 14-6 major decision over No.4 seed Gabe Gienger, St. Francis.

In the championship finals, he wrestled No.3 seed and No.4 state ranked Scott Miller, Oberlin. Miller had pinned No.2 state ranked Spencer Burns, Cimarron, in the semi-finals. It was the first defeat for Burns, who entered the match 33-0.

Roe led 9-4 after the first period of his title match with Miller. Neither wrestler scored in the second period but Roe outscored Miller 5-2 in the third period to win a 14-6 decision and the gold medal.

Roe's record is now 33-1.

Sprigg extended his unbeaten record to 33-0.

Walz placed third with a 4-0 decision over Appel.

Jon Harding was seeded No.2 at 130 pounds. In his first match, he pinnedAndrewVrbas,Atwood,in 37 seconds. Next, he pinned Brian Keller, Ellis, in 1:29. In the semifinals, he won a 12-3 major decision over No.3 seed Drake Moore, Oakley. In the championship finals, he wrestled No.1 state ranked and No.1 seed Tait Weatherbee, TMP, who placed second in the state tournament last season.

Harding trailed 2-0 after one period and 6-1 after two periods but finished strong and outscored Weatherbee 3-0 in the third period to make the final score 6-4 in Weatherbee's favor.

Harding's record is now 27-10 The top three ranked wrestlers in the state at 119 pounds com-

Neither wrestler scored in the first period. VanEaton took a 3-0 lead in the second period and won a 3-1 decision to earn the bronze medal.
