Businesses can get loans

Businesses in Norton, Decatur, Phillips and Smith counties and Furnas, Harlan and Red Willow counties in Nebraska, can apply for low interest Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration.

The deadline for filing an application is Aug. 29.

The loans are available to help businesses meet normal expenses that cannot be met because of the effects of a disaster.

Last year's drought caused problems for many farmers and ranchers, which in turn hurt businesses dependent on them.

Farmers and ranchers are not eligible, but may be eligible for other disaster assistance programs.

However, nurseries, that are victims of drought, can apply.

To get an application or receive more information, interested business owners may call the Small Business Administration toll-free at 1-800-366-6303 or 817-267-4688 for the hearing impaired.
