Norton boys get big win over Hoisington

The No.1 seeded Norton Community High School boys basketball team took care of business on Tuesday night by defeating No.8 seeded Hoisington 70-32 in the first round of the Class 3A Sub-State Basketball Tournament in the NCHS Memorial Gym in Norton.

Senior forward Ryan Maddy sustained a deep cut over one eye while diving on the floor for a loose ball with 6:58 left in the second quarter and did not return until the fourth quarter. Maddy has been a key scorer and rebounder for the Blue Jays.

"When Ryan went out, we stepped up our play," said Coach Doug Reusink.

"In the second half, we still maintained our intensity. We even had some young players come in and do some good things.

"It was a good victory but it will be tough from here on. There's not a lot of difference in the top six teams in this tournament."

With the victory, Norton extended their season record to 15-

Coach Kevin Jilka's No.2 seeded Norton Community High School girls basketball team defeated No.7 seeded Hoisington 62-36 in the first round of the Class 3A Sub-State Tournament on Tuesday in the NCHS Memorial Gym in Norton.

In other first round games, No.1 seed Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays defeated No.8 Phillipsburg 70-29, No.4 seed Lakin outpointed No.5 Ellinwood 56-52 and No.3 Holcomb outscored No.6 Cimarron 63-48. The Lady Jays got off to a slow start but, once they warmed up, there was no doubt about the outcome.

Norton took a 7-0 lead to start the game but trailed 12-10 after one quarter. Most of Norton's first quarter points came on baskets in the paint as junior centers Chelsea Cox and Becca Ebert each hit two baskets. Cox and junior guard Whitney Newell each added a free throw.

Hoisington scored the first four points of the second quarter to take a 16-10 lead but the Lady Cardinals went scoreless the rest of the half and the Lady Jays took a 26-16 halftime lead. Cox swished three more baskets and three free throws, Newell buried a three-point shot, Ebert hit another basket and junior guard Karlie Jones hit her first points of the game on two charities in the second quarter.
