Championship wrestlers and coaches honored

The back-to-back Class 3-2-1A state high school wrestling champions from Norton Community High School and their coaches and managers were honored during halftime of the Norton boys basketball game on Tuesday, March 1 in the Memorial Gym in Norton.

Bruce Poage, the "Voice of the Blue Jays", began by telling the large crowd that this was the first year in Norton's long history of wrestling excellence that the Blue Jays repeated as state champions.


After winning the championship with a 275 pound overtime victory by Michael Sprigg in 2003-'04, the Blue Jays didn't wait until the final match in 2004-'05 but led from start to finish in rolling to the championship and leaving the second-place team trailing by 51.5 points.

"This year's state champions add a new chapter to the already long and rich Norton wrestling tradition," said Poage. "The accomplishments of this year's Blue Jay wrestling team are as impressive as they are extensive."

Poage stated that Norton went undefeated in dual competition and won the Mid-Continent League dual championship for the tenth consecutive year and dominated the league tournament, winning it for the sixth year in a row and ninth out of the past ten years.

He stated that they won five of six invitational tournaments, including the championship of the 48th annual Newton Tournament of Champions. Norton was the smallest enrollment school to ever win this prestigious tournament.

"During the year, Norton met and finished above the eventual Kansas 6A tournament runner-up, the Kansas 5A champions, the


