

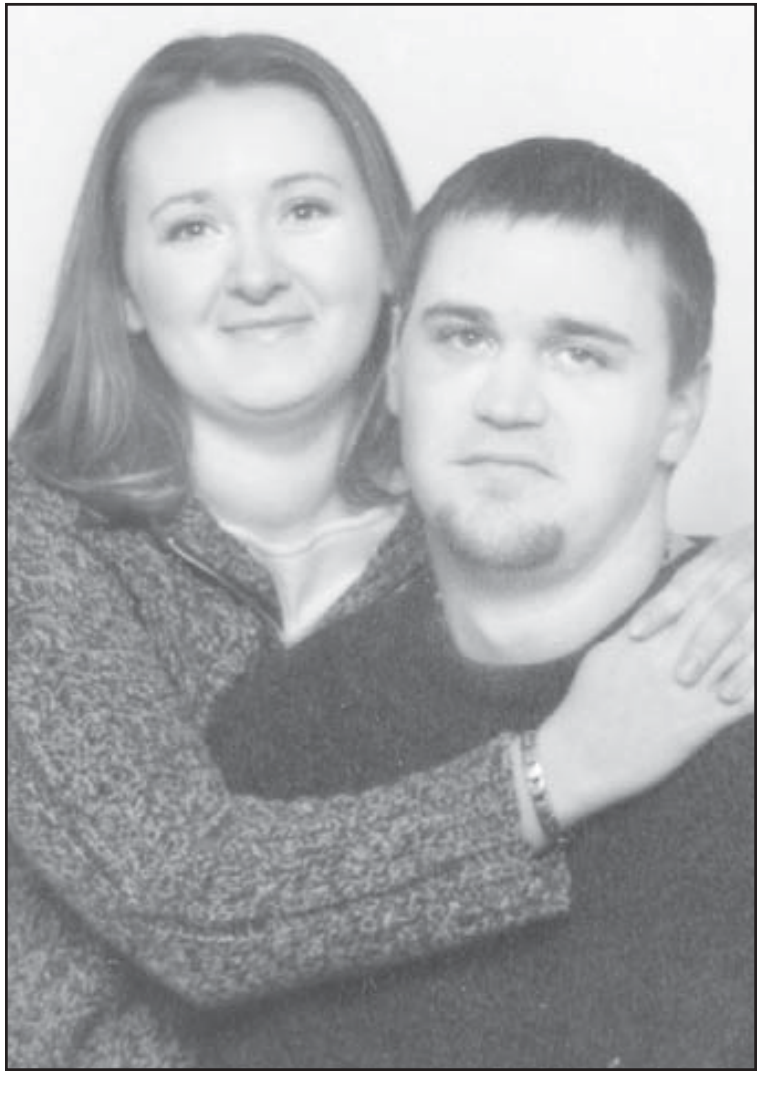
OBITUARY

Leo Carroll Booth

Leo Carroll Booth, 81, of Norton, died Wednesday at Norton County Hospital. The son of Clifford and Alice Booth, he was born Dec. 7, 1923, in Orleans, Neb. He attended rural grade school in the Long Island area. During World War II he served in the U.S. Army. On Sept. 18, 1949, he and Barbara Skrdlant were married in Norton. They lived in Phillipsburg for a short time and then returned to Norton where he was a lineman with Norton-Decatur Electrical Co-op for more than 30 years. He was a member of the Harmonson-Redd American Legion Post and the Veterans of Foreign Wars, where he was the medical equipment chairman for many years. He also coached Little League baseball for several years.

He was preceded in death by his parents and a brother, Gerald. Survivors include: his wife, Barbara, of the home; three sons Ronald and Diane Booth, Leavenworth, Wayne and Beverly Booth, Branson, Mo., and Larry and Sara Booth, McLouth; a daughter Carlene and Leo Johnson, Midlothian, Va.; and five grandchildren.
